I want all of our members to be aware of why we are holding off on our Election process. Please understand, the State of NJ does not consider our village elections political. Without a long explanation, just know We are private. Therefore, in order to meet the guidelines set forth...no matter the capacity of our room, we cannot gather with more than 25 people...total. Not 25% (which is still a small amount). The numbers of COVID-19 cases has risen in the past two weeks and we will not roll the dice at the risk of the Village. Below is a small section of the executive order. I sincerely hope our residents are supportive of the delay. Again, please note our elections are NOT a political event.

State of New Jersey Governor Murphy's Executive order 173 (refer to page 6 paragraph 1, center page)

1. Paragraph 1 of Executive Order No. 156 (2020) is hereby rescinded and the number of individuals at indoor gatherings that are not religious services or celebrations, political activities, wedding ceremonies, funerals or memorial services shall be limited to 25% of the capacity of the room in which it takes place, but regardless of the capacity of the room, such limit shall never be larger than 25 persons or smaller than 10 persons. The number of individuals at indoor gatherings that are religious services or celebrations, political activities, wedding ceremonies, funerals, or memorial services shall be limited to 25% of the capacity of the room in which it takes place, but regardless of the capacity of the room, such limit shall never be larger than 100 persons or smaller than 10 persons. For purposes of this Paragraph, any private residence or residential unit shall be treated as a single "room".

2020 GENERAL ELECTION

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2020 - POLLS OPEN 6 A.M. TO 8 P.M.

Manchester will have 10 polling locations. See https://manchestertwp.com/wp-content/uploads/2020/09/GENERAL-2020-POLLING-LOCATIONS.pdf

There is no need to request a mail-in ballot in New Jersey. Ballots are being mailed to every active registered voter. There is no need to add postage to your ballot as paid return postage is provided to all New Jersey voters. Ballots should be mailed out to voters the last week of September or the first week in October.

Absentee ballots ceased to exist a few years ago and are now called "Vote by mail" ballots. That means you may vote by mail for any reason.

The state and county have provided several assurances that will provide security of their ballots. You may use any of the drop-off location boxes for delivery of your ballot. There will be 17+ mail-in drop-off boxes located throughout the county for those voters preferring not to mail in their ballots. Two of these drop-off boxes are in Manchester at the Manchester Branch of the Ocean County Library located on Colonial Drive next to Town Hall at the library entrance and the other is the Whiting - Ocean County Library Reading Room located at 400 Lacey Rd Whiting. Check the Vote.NJ.Gov portal for additional locations outside Manchester Township. Each drop-off box is under 24-hour camera surveillance and will be picked up daily by both a republican and democrat jointly and delivered to the Ocean County Board of Elections to be counted.

There is a portal for voters to track their ballots to ensure delivery. The link is located on the Vote.NJ.Gov website. Voters may also wait in line at the polls, sign the register and hand in their ballots to poll workers in person or deliver their ballots personally to the Ocean County Board of Elections, 129 Hooper Ave., Toms River.

Only voters that certify that they are handicapped or visually impaired are to utilize voting machines at the polls provided they have not sent in their mail-in ballot which will be verified at the polling location prior to casting your vote. An affidavit of disability will also need to be filled out at the polling location. Every other voter that arrives to vote in person will vote a provisional paper ballot. Please note that mail-in ballots will be counted and included in the election day results. Provisional ballots may take a week to process.

For those qualified handicapped or visually impaired voters, your polling location will be listed on the mail-in ballot that you receive in the mail, on our township website or by calling the township clerk's office directly. Please check this list as the township will only have 10 ten polling locations open instead of the usual 20.

These regulations apply across the State of New Jersey and conform to the Governor's Executive orders in response to COVID-19.

Our medical necessity application is designed to obtain information to help us provide services needed.

The most common medical necessities are dialysis and chemo/radiation treatments.

While we are aware that many of our residents have medical conditions and needs, we simply cannot put everyone on a priority list. Eligible residents are those with life sustaining appointments during a snow event. The form requires the days and times of your treatment to help us prepare for your special needs.

Please note, a NEW FORM IS REQUIRED EACH YEAR.







Hello everyone! It was great seeing many of you that came to enjoy the music on October 11th, and for many of us, we also got some exercise by doing some dancing.


It was a good turnout with about 75 people, many were from the other villages. To all who came, thank you and hope you had a great time.

The United States Marine Corps

U.S. History/Britannica

The United States Marine Corps, separate military service within the U.S. Department of the Navy, charged with the provision of marine troops for seizure and defense of advanced bases and with conducting operations on land and in the air incident to naval campaigns. It is also responsible for providing detachments for service aboard certain types of naval vessels, as well as security forces for naval shore installations and U.S. diplomatic missions in foreign countries The corps specializes in amphibious landings, such as those undertaken against Japanese-held islands in the Pacific during World War II.

The Marine Corps was founded on November 10, 1775, when the Continental Congress ordered that two battalions of Marines be raised for service as landing forces with the fleet. Marines have participated in all wars of the United States, being in most instances first, or among the first, to fight. In addition, Marines have executed more than 300 landings on foreign shores and served in every major U.S. naval action since 1775.

The U.S. Marine Corps is structured according to National Security Act of 1947 and its amendments of 1952. The commandant of the corps has coequal status with members of the Joint Chiefs of Staff in all matters pertaining to the corps. The corps is composed of two operating forces, the Fleet Marine Force, Pacific (FMFPAC) and the Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic (FMFLANT); a supporting establishment for recruiting, training, supply logistics, and maintenance of bases, installations, and schools; and the Marine Corps Reserve.

The Marine Corps emblem is the Western Hemisphere superimposed on a foul anchor and surmounted by a spread eagle. The, Corps motto is Semper Fidelis (Latin: "Always Faithful"), which is also the Corps march, composed by John Philip Sousa. Perhaps even more familiar is "The Marines Hymn." The Marine Band, the oldest musical organization in the U.S. forces, is known as "The President's Own" because of its privilege at all state functions at the White House. The official colours of the Corps are scarlet and gold, but forest green enjoys semi official recognition. The distinctive dress-blue uniform of Marines, with its standing collar, is well known. From the standing collar-descended from the tall leather neckpiece of the 18th-19th- century uniform comes the traditional nickname for Marines of "leathernecks." The forest-green service uniform was introduced in 1912. In naval formations, Marines have the privilege of forming on the right of the line or at the head of column, the traditional places of honour and seniority.
