FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

To clarify having another election in December:

1. We, the board, in order to be within the By-Laws needed to have an election to fill the 3 available seats. This Board wanted the residents to vote for a candidate of their choice. There were 4 candidates running to fill 3 seats. Unfortunately 1 candidate, Kathy Sligo, rescinded her resume after the deadline cut off, and we could not entertain new resumes. Therefore, the 3 remaining candidates automatically fill the 3 open seats for a 2 year term (By-Law page 5-1.d.) They were sworn in by the Board Secretary, December 22nd and will be again at the Homeowners/Sunshine meeting January 20, 2022.

2. In September there were 5 elected to the Board. The one with the least amount of votes only filled the vacancy until the next election, which would have been December 21, 2021 (By-Laws page 4 -1.b.)

3. In 2022 there will be yet another election for 4 seats. The 4 on the Board will have to run again after serving only 1 year of what should have been a 2 year term. This needs to be done to bring us within the By-laws and back on track to rectify the situation created by the previous Board.

Please note:

Once a trustee is voted out of office or resigns, they NO longer have trustee PRIVILEGES at the Clubhouse or within the Village. They return to being a resident with all resident privileges.




