

National Freedom Day



National Freedom Day is an observance in the United States and is celebrated every year on **February 1st**. The day commemorates the signing by Abraham Lincoln of a resolution for the 13TH amendment to the American Constitution, that proposed the abolishment of slavery. It is not a public holiday, therefore businesses follow normal working hours.

History of National Freedom Day: On the 1st of February 1865 the American House and Senate passed a joint resolution that would later become the 13th amendment to the constitution of the United States. This amendment was signed by Abraham Lincoln, who was the President at the time, effectively outlawing slavery in America. Although the signing happened in February, it wasn't until December 6th 1865 that the amendment was approved, and thus added to the constitution. However, February 1st was chosen as the day to celebrate, as it was the first official step in the direction of freedom from slavery.

Who created National Freedom Day? Major Richard Robert Wright Sr.had been a slave for 9 years at the time that the amendment was signed. After gaining back his freedom, he attended a school freedom and went on to become a Veteran in the Spanish-American War, a banker, and a teacher. Known and respected as a leader in his community, Major Wright was the one who first thought that there should be an official day to celebrate the abolishment of slavery.

After creating the National Freedom Day Association, he lobbied in Congress for the recognition on National Freedom Day in the American holidays' calendar. The first unofficial celebration of the day took place on February 1st 1942.

However, Major Richard Wright would never see his wish come to fruition, as it wasn't until 1947 a year after his death, that Congress passed a bill making National Freedom Day an observance. This was officialized by President Harry Truman who signed the bill on June 30th 1948.

National Freedom Day celebrations: Every year it is the President of the United States who decides whether National Freedom Day should be celebrated.

Many towns in America hold their festivals and celebrations to observe this day. It is mostly a day for Americans to reflect on the freedom that their country provides them, as well as on the freedom of their fellow nationals.

Some still follow tradition started in 1942 of laying a wreath of flowers on the Liberty Bell, which has become one of the biggest American symbols of freedom.

Governor Murphy Announces Expanded Income Eligibility for Prescription Drug Assistance Programs Expanded Income Eligibility is Largest One-Time Increase in History of the Programs POSTED ON: JANUARY 7, 2022 - 10:10AM


Governor Phil Murphy today announced that income limits for the Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (PAAD) and the Senior Gold Prescription Discount drug assistance programs have increased by \$10,000, making drug prices more affordable and benefitting over 20,000 seniors. Raising the income threshold, which was part of Governor Murphy's Fiscal Year 2022 budget, is the largest one-time increase in the history of both the PAAD and Senior Gold Prescription Discount drug assistance programs. This initiative is a part of the Governor's ongoing and broader commitment and programming to make health care more affordable for New Jersey residents across provider, insurance, and prescription drug costs.

"Few issues have a greater financial impact on New Jersey families than the ever-increasing cost of prescription drugs," said Governor Murphy. "Making New Jersey a more affordable place to call home means working to address the cost of prescription drug medicine. I am extremely proud of the progress we have made with this historic benefit increase that will expand benefits to thousands of New Jerseyans."

The PAAD and Senior Gold Prescription Discount drug assistant programs are available to residents 65 and older and those with disabilities. PAAD cuts drug prices to \$5 for covered generic drugs and \$7 for covered name brands. Senior Gold cuts prices in half after a \$15 copay for covered prescriptions. The PAAD program income limits are now \$38,769 if single and \$45,270 for a couple. The Senior Gold Prescription Discount program limits are now \$48,769 if single and \$55,270 if married. Assets are not an eligibility consideration for either program.

Income limits for the Lifeline utility assistance program and the Hearing Aid Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (HAAAD) program have also increased by \$10,000, as those programs are tied to PAAD.

Eligible older residents and individuals with disabilities are urged to apply now through the NJSave online application, download an application from the NJSave webpage, or ask for a paper application by calling 1-800-792-9745. Online and paper applications are available in English and Spanish.

From the Board of Trustees

To clarify a By-Law....

No one person may own more than one (1) unit (home) in the Community Association. In the case of married couples or domestic partnerships in the event the married couples or domestic partners own the unit as Joint Tenants or as Tenants by Entirety, then neither may own another unit in the Community Association, and in event a unit is titled in the name of one (1) spouse or partner the other spouse or partner may not own a unit in the Community Association. By-Laws page 1 – ARTICLE II – MEMBERSHIP..... SECTION 1. Eligibility

Clarification on By Laws Changes:

PREDFED – Planned Real Estate Development Full Disclosure Act

State of New Jersey Department of Community Affairs

Laws made by the State must be added to our Covenants and our Bylaws. Homeowners do not get to vote on these, we must abide by them

The Radburn Law passed in 2017, regarding elections, are only now being reviewed to be added to our bylaws and covenant by a committee of 7. After committee completes their process, it will go to our lawyer for review. The addition of these new laws will be brought to the Clerk of Ocean County, recorded, stamped with a book and page number and added to both our convents and bylaws for homeowners to abide by.

There is a procedure for our bylaws to be ADDED TO, CLARIFIED, or to CHANGE. Any additions, clarifications or changes made, must go before the homeowners to vote on. (except Radburn as stated above) The homeowners will get a copy of our standing bylaw, and a copy of what will be changed. When the change/ changes are agreed upon, they are sent to our lawyer for review. Upon receipt from lawyer, the new change/changes are brought to the Clerk of Ocean County, recorded, stamped with a book and page number and then added to our covenants and our bylaws that we must now abide by.
