

### GREETINGS FROM THE BOARD FEBRUARY 2023

Thank you to the residents for the wonderful Holiday Baskets and goodies for both the board and office personnel.

Thank you for your growing support for the Team of Change. As promised, we work daily for the betterment of our community and to break the divide. Your continued, and increasing support makes it all worthwhile.

Our New Years Eve party was a complete success! Many thanks to all the people who came out to V7 to celebrate the New Year! It was a fantastic event, great food from Italys Best, wonderful music, free photo booth, 50/50's, door prize giveaways, dancing and the open bar! Next year's New Year's Eve at V7 will be even better!!

The quarterly meeting was held on December 20th @ 10 a.m. There was 1 resident present. The previous minutes were read for the 3 months, and there were no questions.

We are now trying a Saturday Sunshine meeting to accommodate residents. This will be on a trial basis. We have had morning meetings, evenings meetings, morning and evening meetings. We realize we can't please everyone as we have 1048 homes in V7 and we did receive an increase in attendance of maybe 50 to 55 people.

The Board proposed the Budget of 2023/2024 with the approval of our accountant. There has been one \$2.00 increase in 9 years. Our accountant has always advised to increase our dues to meet the cost of inflation, this has never been done. There will be a \$10.00 increase to our maintenance fee for a total of \$148.00 a month, effective April 1, 2023. This increase was necessary as we had a 2022 budget for 9 months versus 12, and that loss of 3 months income was due to interference.

The cost of our contracts cost were increased by Stanley, Ozane (due to outside interference) and a costly raise in our insurance. Our biggest killer is the Stout contract, that was signed before this board was elected, for \$83,000. This absurd contract is for another 1 ½ years!

REPLACEMENT FUND: The purpose of the replacement fund is to accumulate funds over the lives of assets which are part of the common elements so that at the time of their replacement

sufficient amounts have been accumulated, ie. paved surfaces, illumination, retaining walls, stormwater management, etc. Think of this fund as a saving account.

The Resident's Club Committee is <u>starting up</u> Saturday February 21 @ 2:00 p.m. in our auditorium. This is the <u>ORIGINAL Resident's Club</u>, minus the board. There will only be a Treasurer, and this club/committee will report to the Board of Trustees. If you are at all interested, please attend. We will be looking for volunteers to work Bingo on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month. If we have the volunteers there will be a bingo. Bring your ideas, your crafts, etc.

### The Peace Accord of 1973



Negotiations to end the war began in May of 1968, under the presidency of Lyndon B. Johnson. North Vietnam demanded an immediate halt to the US bombing of North Vietnam while the US demanded the North de-escalate and start removing troops from the South. On October 31st, 1968, President Johnson ordered a halt to the bombing of North Vietnam. Many people thought the bombing halt was begun to help elect Hubert Humphrey, Johnson's vice president and the Democratic nominee for president. Richard Nixon was the Republican nominee for president.

Nixon won the election and became president on January 20th, 1969. The Paris Peace talks began between the US and North Vietnam on August 4th, 1969.

One of the issues Nixon had to deal with was getting the North Vietnamese to the negotiating table. To increase the pressure and get the North Vietnamese to negotiate, Nixon escalated the bombing campaign against the North . Nixon ordered Operation Linebacker, a major aerial bombardment campaign, to begin in early May 1972. It drove the North Vietnamese back to the negotiating table in August 1972.

Much of the negotiations were conducted in secret between Nixon's National Security Advisor Henry Kissinger and Le Duc Tho, a member of the North Vietnamese Politburo. For the next three years, until May 1972, the negotiators made very little headway with North Vietnam demanding that the president of South Vietnam, Nguyen Van Thieu, be replaced. In May 1972, Nixon decided that the US would withdraw troops under a ceasefire without North Vietnam withdrawing their troops.

On October 8th, 1972 after North Vietnam's Easter Offensive attempt to invade South Vietnam failed, Tho agreed that the South Vietnamese government and the Republic of South Vietnam (the group representing South Vietnam communists) could determine their own power-sharing arrangement.

Ten days later, an agreement had been drawn up between Tho and Kissinger. However, Thieu refused to accept the agreement and Tho thought he been lied to by Kissinger, so he pulled out of the negotiations. Nixon, to show that he was willing to stand up for Thieu, launched Operation Linebacker II, a major bombing campaign against North Vietnamese in December 1972. The bombing campaign stopped on December 30th when Tho returned to negotiate. On January 15th, 1973, Nixon announced a halt to offensive operations and the final peace agreement was signed on January 27th , 1973.



### SNOW REMOVAL GUIDELINES DO NOT CALL THE OFFICE FOR PLOWING PROGRESS!

Below is a reminder of the procedures that all residents in Crestwood Village VII must adhere to during snow events.


- Generally, snow removal will not begin until the snow has stopped falling.
- Plowing will not start until snow accumulation has reached three (3) inches.
- The main roads will be plowed first.
- Resident's that are on the priority plowing list (for priority list information, see below) will have their driveways completed as the main roads are being plowed.
- Driveways and finger streets will be plowed when main roads and priority plowing is completed.
- After all the plowing has been completed, the walkways will be shoveled.
- If your car is parked in your driveway at the time the plow comes along, your driveway will not be plowed. If you go out and move your car, the plows will not return.
- If you have a paver driveway abutting your driveway, that portion will not be plowed.
- The Resident is responsible for any snow remaining on the driveway after it has been plowed, this includes blowing or drifting snow.
- Cars that are left on the street or finger street during a snowstorm may be towed, at the owner's expense, so that the streets can be adequately plowed.
- Salting of roads will be based on conditions/ temperature and at the discretion of the Trustees.

As with any other situation, if you have a medical emergency during a storm, do not call the Association office to be plowed out, please call 911.

PLEASE DO NOT CALL THE ANSWERING SERVICE AFTER HOURS BECAUSE YOU HAVE NOT BEEN PLOWED. THE ANSWERING SERVICE CANNOT PROVIDE ANY INFORMATION AND CANNOT DISPATCH THE PLOWS. YOU CAN CALL THE VILLAGE HOTLINE FOR UPDATES AT 732-350-4358.

NON EMERGENCY CALLS MADE TO THE AFTER HOURS ANSWERING SERVICE MAY BE CHARGED BACK TO THE RESIDENT.

If you are receiving Dialysis or other Life Saving treatments that require you to go to a treatment facility despite the weather, please submit the Emergency Snow Removal form (found on our website and available at the office) and a doctor's note to the office so you can be added to the priority list.
