FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MAY 2023

So as not to be confused by what Residents may have been told or had overheard on the following items: Be advised all was fact checked and brought before legal counsel.

Yes, anybody can sue anyone, in today's world. Just make sure your proof is steadfast.

The Board of Trustees is 100% indemnified and held harmless. The Board also has a D & O insurance policy which protects the Board from liability. Board members are not indemnified in cases of proven theft of funds. Therefore, anyone can make idle threats, such as to take the house away from a board member not adhering to a Radburn law, or Robert's Rules of Orders.

The statement made by someone taking full credit for a resigning board member due to their idle threats of suing twice, is not so. Fact checked: The resigning member was informed they were to be voted off the board, so as to avoid having this failure on their record, in haste they had their resignation letter brought into the office on a Sunday morning, for Monday's opening. Truth.

The annex was built by proceeds from members and outsiders' contributions through attendance at events hosted by the Residents club. The annex has a room the Resident Club used 4 Saturdays a month. Fact checked: There is NO written agreement that can be found that this room "belongs" to the Residents club as stated. Why the big argument about renting this room now? Therefore, are we to foolishly turn down yearly income that benefits the entire Community? The Board voted and the room will be rented effective April 1st for \$400 a month the first year and \$500 a month in 2024. The Residents club has many other options of space to utilize.

As members of the Association, you should take the initiative to walk through the clubhouse. Check out the card room, gym, pool room, library, pantry, auditorium, annex and the BC room. The BC room was at some point divided into 2 rooms by a curtain, hence the term B and C room. Today it is 1 large room with no curtain and still called the BC room.

Any member is entitled to obtain a copy of the By-Laws, Rules and Regulations, the budget and audit. The protocol for years going way back to 2015, YOU are to come into the office and request a copy. The Covenants are available on our website: WVCA@WHITINGVILLAGE.COM. Do not expect anyone to hand deliver to you personally.

The Board's Executive meetings on Tuesdays are closed to all members. An open meeting is NOT required. A board member was accused of not replying to a letter mailed to them. Fact checked. No proof that a letter was ever mailed. If you are going to accuse someone that they received a letter, you best have sent 1 regular mail, and 1 certified mail. The certified mail is your proof of record. Waving a piece of paper saying you mailed it is hearsay, and that is gossip.

The other day a statement was made, that 2 sets of books were discovered years ago by said person and our Accountant Skip. Fact checked with Skip our accountant. He was irate at such an accusation and stated emphatically no such discovery was ever found by him and this absolutely, positively never happened.

The Board of Trustees has the right to purchase items, not to exceed \$10,000.00 without the vote of Residents Members. Therefore, the 3 entry signs on S. Chestnut, N. Chestnut and Westport have been voted, approved, and ordered by the Board and will be installed when weather permits.

Regarding Voluntary Assessments, Section 3, page 30 of our By-Laws. The explanation recently given by a resident was so wrong. Per legal council A capital improvement of more than \$10,000 that is not in the budget ie. a voluntary 2nd story building, or a pool, that is a capital improvement in excess of \$10,000, and not necessary and not in the budget, the members of the village association shall elect (vote) to make the improvement or replacement. In such an event, the Board of Trustees shall assess all the members of the community as provided for in the Resolution authorizing the improvement. EXAMPLE:. Installation of a pool is costing \$100,000; this would be divided amongst the 1048 members, \$95.41 per member for a one time assessment.

In our lobby is a dedication to The United States' six military branches of our Armed Forces. The other day, a few members overheard a rant "The Board is giving away the residents' real estate" in regard to this small dedicated area. Fact checked: This real estate property section, 36" x 44", a tiny corner in the clubhouse lobby, was planned years ago to be placed in that exact spot to honor our 6 military branches. What a wee section of our real estate property to show appreciation for the lives given up for our freedom.

To reiterate, all of the aforementioned were fact checked and every item was brought before legal counsel.

EVACUATIONS PLANS

Know what actions to take to protect yourself during a disaster. We bit the bullet for the 2nd time, a tornado warning a few weeks ago and the fire last Tuesday.

Your local authorities will evaluate and determine your exit when necessary, and will notify you during a disaster through radio, TV local news channels or NOAA stations (weather radio.. see your local Red Cross shop or Amazon)

Go to your safe area, or where you are directed to go by authorities. Have a survival bag ready at all times for easy access to grab and go.

The bag should include: food i.e. peanut butter, granola bars, dried fruits and water (1 gallon per person, per day)

Also have copies of personal documents, medicine list, medical information, deed/lease to home, passport, birth certificates, insurance policies, flash light, extra batteries, cell and charger, set of extra clothes, blanket, family and emergency contacts, extra cash, whistle, N95 mask, matches, rain gear, and towels. Don't forget your pet, take their supplies too as collar, leash, food and carrier bowl.

Your local authorities will guide you, there are many factors to consider, including keeping the calm, to avoid further danger to the residents of the area. There is a chain of command that must be followed, and those in charge Sgt. Sharry of the Emergency Management, along with the Fire Chief, and Mayor are the only ones to make the decision to evacuate.

How to Display The American Flag



The U.S. flag stands for our nation and the shared history, pride, principles, and commitment of its people. When we properly display this powerful symbol, we signal our respect for everything it represents.



The flag shouldn't be flown in inclement weather unless it's an all-weather flag.



Flags displayed at night should be properly illuminated.



In a time of national mourning, hang the flag at half-mast.

The flag can be flown every day, but it is often flown to show patriotism on these observances:

New Year's Day	Easter Sunday	Constitution Day
Inauguration Day	Armed Forces Day	Columbus Day
Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday	Memorial Day	Navy Day
Lincoln's Birthday	Flag Day	Veterans Day

When displaying the flag ...



From your porch, place the union (blue section) at the peak of the staff.



Against a wall or on a window, place the union (blue section) at the top left corner.



On your vehicle, clamp the staff to the right front fender.



With another flag, place the U.S. flag to your left when crossed.



Keep your flag completely dry and folded properly — into a triangle, with the union (blue section) visible — before storing it in a well-ventilated area. If the flag is damaged or worn out, it should be disposed of with dignity.



The flag should not touch anything below it or rest on the ground.

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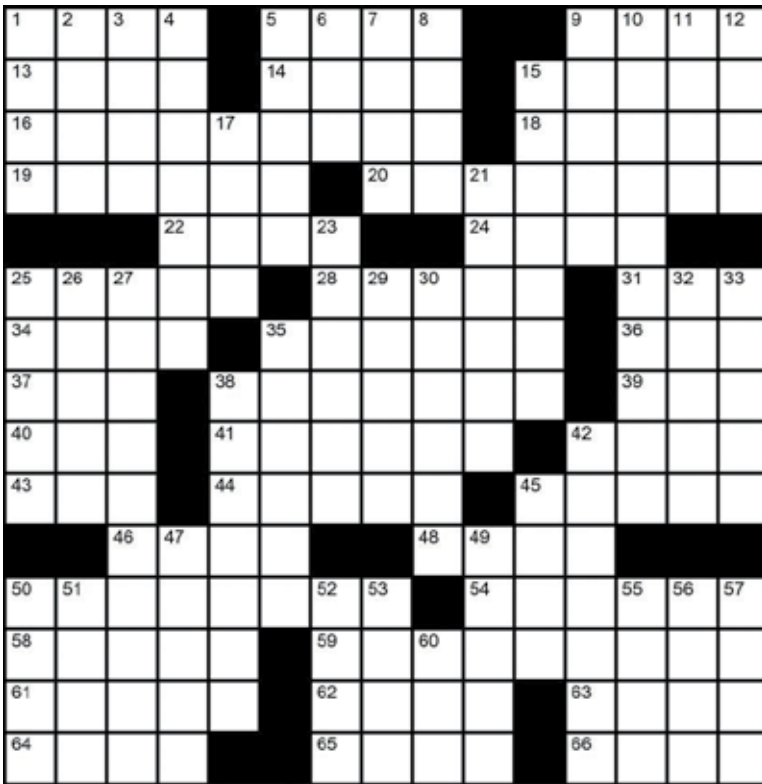
