

#### ATTENTION RESIDENTS OF MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP

The Manchester Township Department of Utilities will be flushing fire hydrants between the months of October & November 2023. Each community will be notified when flushing begins in their area. Hours will vary during the day as well os during the night. During this time, you will experience a difference in pressure and discoloration. Run your cold-water tap anily until it runs clear.

We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

#### **Emergency Calls:**

When a resident places a calls to the office after business hours the answering service answers the call. If a resident requests a technician to come out, the dispatcher sends out a service technician to assess and possibly repair the issue. Once that request has been made the resident is responsible for the emergency service charge (\$65.00), regardless if they change their mind, fix it their self, etc. Therefore, if your service call can wait and is deemed not an emergency, please call the office during regular business hours to place your service call and pay the regular service rate. This information is in the General Service of Maintenance packet that all homeowners are given when they purchase a house in the village and when it is updated as well as posted on the village website.

#### NAVY DAY

In the United States, the Navy League of the United States, organized the first Navy Day in 1922 holding it on October 27 because it was the birthday of the 26th President Theodore Roosevelt (1859-1919, served 1901-1909), who was a naval enthusiast/promoter of sea power and former assistant Secretary of the Navy just before the Spanish-American War of 1898. Although meeting with mixed reviews the first year, in 1923 over 50 major cities participated, and the United States Navy sent a number of its ships to various port cities for the occasion. The 1945 Navy Day was a especially large celebration, with 33rd President Harry S. Trueman(1884-1972, served 1945-1953), reviewing the returning American fleet home in New York Harbor after victory in World War II.

In 1949, Louis A. Johnson, (1891-1966, served 1949-1950), second Secretary of the newly merged and created Department of Defense, directed that the U.S. Navy's participation occur on newly established Armed Forces for the unified/coordinated uniformed services in May, although as a private civilian organization, the Navy League was not affected by this directive, and continued to organize separate Navy Day celebrations as before. In 1970s, historical research found that the "birthday" of the earlier Continental Navy during the American Revolutionary War (1775-1783), was determined to be October 13, 1775, and so Chief Naval Operations Admiral Elmo R. Zumwalt worked with the Navy League to define October 13th as the new date of Navy Day. However, Navy Day in the United States is still largely recognized as October 27th.

## KIRMS PHOTOGRAPHY Autumn Colors

Autumn is here and I'm looking forward to photographing this year's fall foliage. The leaves are starting to change. Hopefully the colors this year will be spectacular.

Before the colors are at their peak I look for individual trees that have great color. I also scout out areas that I think will look great at peak time so I'll be ready when the leaves finally turn. I prefer areas that have the trees reflected in water.

Check out the farm markets for some colorful shots and don't forget the cranberry harvest. Fallen leaves make interesting patterns, so don't forget to look down. Rolls of hay in the fields also make nice images.


A great way to enhance your images is using a polarizing filter. This filter works the same as polarizing sunglasses – it is designed to cut glare and reflections. Removing the glare from the leaves makes the colors brighter and more saturated. Simply rotate the polarizing filter until the sky or leaves are at their darkest.


Fall Foliage images are best shot on days when there is no wind. By scouting a great location ahead of time, using a polarizing filter, and applying good rules of composition you'll get some fantastic shots of this autumn's spectacular show.
