The General Election will be November 5th from 6 am to 8pm in Fernwood Hall.







SNOW REMOVAL GUIDELINES <u>DO NOT CALL THE OFFICE FOR PLOWING PROGRESS!</u>

Below is a reminder of the procedures that all residents in Crestwood Village VII must adhere to during snow events.

- Generally, snow removal will not begin until the snow has stopped falling.
- Plowing will not start until snow accumulation has reached three (3) inches.
- The main roads will be plowed first.
- Resident's that are on the priority plowing list (for priority list information, see below) will have their driveways completed as the main roads are being plowed.
- Driveways and finger streets will be plowed when main roads and priority plowing is completed.
- If your car is parked in your driveway at the time the plow comes along, your driveway will not be plowed. If you go out and move your car, the plows will not return.
- The Resident is responsible for any snow remaining on the driveway after it has been plowed, this includes blowing or drifting snow.
- Cars that are left on the street or finger street during a snowstorm may be towed, at the owner's expense, so that the streets can be adequately plowed.
- Salting of roads will be based on conditions/ temperature and at the discretion of the Trustees.

As with any other situation, if you have a medical emergency during a storm, do not call the Association office to be plowed out, please call 911.

PLEASE DO NOT CALL THE ANSWERING SERVICE AFTER HOURS BECAUSE YOU HAVE NOT BEEN PLOWED. THE ANSWERING SERVICE CANNOT PROVIDE ANY INFORMATION AND CANNOT DISPATCH THE PLOWS. YOU CAN CALL THE VILLAGE HOTLINE FOR UPDATES AT 732-350-4358.

NON EMERGENCY CALLS MADE TO THE AFTER HOURS ANSWERING SERVICE MAY BE CHARGED BACK TO THE RESIDENT.

If you are receiving Dialysis or other Life Saving treatments that require you to go to a treatment facility despite the weather, please submit the Emergency Snow Removal form and a doctor's note to the office so you can be added to the priority list.

This month I'd like to discuss a very important rule of composition that is too often overlooked - what to include and what to exclude. Often we are so focused on our subject that we fail to see all the other elements that will be in or image.

Any element that diverts attention from your subject will weaken your image. You may have to change your position to find an angle that better suits your composition. Slowing down a little and reviewing the scene will pay big dividends in your final image.

Try shooting from a few different angles to see which works better. Once you've decided on a good position take a look around the edges of your image to make certain you don't have anything peeking in from the sides.

THOUGHTFUL WAYS TO SAY 'THANKS' AT YOUR THANKSGIVING TABLE

Activities to Remind Your Family and Guests the Reason for the Day

Thanksgiving quickly brings to mind thoughts of savory turkeys, sweet pies, and other beloved sides that have been associated with this holiday over the years. With all the delicious dishes on the table aside most people would agree that this holiday is about more than the food. It's really all about gratitude, as the first celebrants of this day believed.

When the family gets together for a special holiday like Thanksgiving, there is often a blessing or special grace said before the meal begins. But since thanks is the focal point of the holiday, why not add another tradition or two that focuses on gratitude, a tradition that may become as special and anticipated as the pumpkin pie? To help you get started, here are a variety of ways you and your family can build on the thankful tradition of this feast.

Thankful Activities for the Whole Family

- Saying Grace with Thanks. If your family always says grace before beginning Thanksgiving dinner, you can easily create a thankful tradition by asking each person around the dinner table, in turn, to express their thanks for something that has occurred over the past year.
- Pass the Gratitude Basket. Give everyone a sheet of paper and a pencil. Then ask each person to write down one thing that makes them feel grateful and put it into a basket. Pass the basket around the table and have everyone read another person's paper, followed by the group guessing who wrote it.
- Thanksgiving Show and Tell. Ask everyone to bring along something that reflects what they are thankful for that year. Then each person, in turn, can share it with the group and tell their story. It might be an item, a photo, a song, or any other item that illustrates their point.
- Read a Story About Thanksgiving. Read a Thanksgiving book as a group. You can choose whether to read about the history of the original Thanksgiving, fictional stories about the day, or a book about ways for families to give thanks. This could be done as everyone waits for the meal to finish cooking. Or it could be a fun activity in between courses to give everyone a chance to digest. You can take turns reading the story and allow even the younger children a chance to show off their developing reading skills.
- Have a Thanksgiving Sing-Along. Download and sing one or all of these kid-friendly songs about

Thanksgiving that include old favorites as well as songs sung by contemporary artists for children.

- Play a Thanksgiving Memory Game. Go around the table and ask each person to name something that makes them feel thankful, but with a catch. Each individual must repeat the thanks of all the people who preceded them before adding their thanks to the list.
- Thanks All Around. Assuming your Thanksgiving table is filled with close friends and family, and not guests who are meeting one another for the first time, go around the table and invite each person to say why they're thankful for the person sitting next to them. It can be the person on their right, left, or even both sides.
- Make a Thanksgiving Scrapbook. Create a holiday scrapbook that will be more cherished as the years pass. Take a blank scrapbook and each year put in photos of the family and friends gathered that year; photos of all of the food served; add notes about special things that happened that day; recipes for the dishes and notes about who created each dish. Ask each person to write in the book what they are thankful for that year.
- Thanks for the Memories. Take out the Thanksgiving scrapbook and leave it within easy reach for everyone to enjoy reading and discussing favorite memories from past years.

Thankful Activities Just for the Kids

- A Picture Says a Thousand Words. Give the children paper and crayons and invite them to draw pictures of the things that they feel most grateful for this year.
- Create a Thankful Mural. Cover a wall with a large piece of kraft paper. Give the children crayons and ask them to draw pictures and words for those things which they are grateful.
- Artful Turkeys. Help the children create turkey pictures using their hands. Tell them (or help younger children) to write what they are thankful for on each feather, followed by coloring in the turkeys. When the turkeys are finished, the children can stand up and tell the group what's written on their feathers. Put these in your scrapbook as one of the memories for that year.


